To Whom It May Concern:

I represent the Sussex County 4-H Market Animal Sale and Social, which will take place at the 2016 NJ State Fair/Sussex County Fairgrounds on Tuesday, August 8, 2017. Each year, leaders and parents of 4-H livestock clubs host a social dinner to honor prospective buyers of 4-H project animals during the sale, which follows the dinner. 4-H members sell their project animal at auction as part of a process to learn about marketing their livestock. Proceeds, after the cost of the social, are returned to the 4-H members as payment for their projects.

The 4-H member's project animal, whether a steer, lamb, pig or goat, requires a daily commitment in feeding, housing and care. Our members learn how to raise as well as sell their livestock. The funds raised through the auction are often used by youth to advance their education through application to a college fund or for investing in the following year's project.

Your organization can partner with 4-H members in our Market Animal Social and Sale. Each year we seek out local sponsors to help defray the costs of the dinner. Savings here, allow us to return more to the 4-H members. We host between 150 and 200 buyers during our social. We would be most grateful if your organization were able to help us through a donation of goods or services.

The Sussex County 4-H Market Animal Sale is an affiliated 4-H organization certified by Rutgers Cooperative Extension. As such, donations made to the Market Animal Sale are tax exempt under IRS guidelines. (A letter confirming this status is attached.)

All donations towards the Social and Sale are recognized with placards on tables during the social, as well as announcements during the auction.


